I will confide something personal to you, in the evening,
before going to bed, I pray this short prayer: 'Lord, if you will,
you can make me clean.' (Luke 5:12). And I pray five 'Our
Fathers,' one for each of Jesus' wounds, because Jesus has
cleansed us by his wounds. If I do this, you can too, at your
home, and say: 'Lord, if you will, you can make me clean' and
think of Jesus' wounds and say one 'Our Father' for each of
them. Jesus always hears us. The leper in the
Gospel does not ask only to be healed, but to be 'cleansed,'
that is, made completely whole, in body and heart. Indeed,
leprosy was considered a kind of curse from God, a form of
deep impurity. The leper had to keep far away from everyone;
he could not enter the temple or any divine service. Far from
God and far from men. What a sad life these people lived. The
leper's plea teaches us that when we present ourselves to
Jesus, it is not necessary to make long speeches, A few words
are enough, provided they are accompanied by full
confidence in his omnipotence and his goodness. Jesus is
deeply struck by this man's faith and trust. Jesus stretches out
his hand and touches him. How often do we really encounter a
poor man when he comes to us? We may even be generous,
we may have pity, but usually we do not touch him. We offer
him a coin, we toss it there, but we avoid touching his hand.
And we forget that that is the body of Jesus. Jesus teaches us
not to be afraid to touch the poor and the outcast, because He
is in them. Examine your conscience at the end each day,
kneel before God and pray: "Lord, if you will, you can make
me clean." Do it, do it before going to bed, every evening,

Voy a confiarle algo personal, Por la noche, antes de ir a la cama,
yo oro esta corta oración: "Señor, si quieres, puedes purificarme."
(Lucas 5:12). Y rezo cinco " Padre nuestros, uno para cada una de las
heridas de Jesús, porque Jesús nos ha purificado con sus heridas. Si
hago esto, tú también, en su casa, puede decir: "Señor, si quieres,
puedes purificarme" y piensa en las heridas de Jesús y digan un
Padrenuestro para cada uno de ellos. Jesús siempre nos escucha, el
leproso en el Evangelio no pide solamente ser curado, sino ser
'purificado', ser sanado integralmente, en el cuerpo y en el corazón.
En efecto, la lepra era considerada una especie de maldición de Dios,
una forma de profunda impureza. El leproso tenía que
mantener lejos de todos; no podía entrar en el templo. Lejos de Dios y
lejos de los hombres. Qué vida triste estas personas vivían. El leproso
nos enseña que cuando nos presentamos a Jesús, no es necesario
hacer muchos discursos, unas pocas palabras son suficientes, siempre
que vayan acompañados de plena confianza en su omnipotencia y su
bondad. Jesús está profundamente impresionado por la fe y la
confianza de este hombre. Jesús extiende su mano y lo toca. ¿Cuántas
veces nos encontramos realmente un hombre pobre?, Podemos
incluso ser generosos, podemos tener piedad, pero por lo general no
lo toques. Le ofrecemos una moneda, echamos allí, pero evitamos
tocar su mano. Y olvidamos que es el cuerpo de Jesús. Jesús nos
enseña a no tener miedo de tocar a los pobres y los marginados,
porque Él está en ellos. Examen tu conciencia al final de cada día,
rodillate ante Dios: "Señor, si quieres, puedes purificarme".
Háganlo, háganlo antes de ir a la cama, cada noche, - **Papa Francisco**
